Civil Liberties Protection and Advancement Grant

Grant Title: Civil Liberties Protection and Advancement Grant

Berkeley JACL Mission: The Berkeley Chapter of the JACL is committed to upholding the human and civil rights of all people, strengthening community ties and fostering coalitions with groups who have similar interests. We strive to promote understanding, respect and appreciation of the rich diversity and contributions of all cultures by preserving and advancing the history of Japanese Americans and all other groups in the United States.

National JACL Mission: The Japanese American Citizens League is a national organization whose ongoing mission is to secure and maintain the civil rights of Japanese Americans and all others who are victimized by injustice and bigotry. The leaders and members of the JACL also work to promote cultural, educational and social values and preserve the heritage and legacy of the Japanese American community.

Program Description: The Civil Liberties Protection and Advancement Grant is a special funding opportunity offered by the Berkeley Chapter of the Japanese American Citizens League to eligible non-profit organizations to support the active defense of the Constitution of the United States. The Japanese American community, like many other devalued communities, has first hand knowledge of how lawless actions by the United States Executive Branch can impact individuals and their families. The Alien Enemies Act was last used against our Issei ancestors (1st generation immigrants) to imprison them without due process and eventually paved the way to the forced incarceration of over 125,000 people of Japanese descent, including citizens of the United States. As an organization largely comprised of former incarcerees and descendants of former incarcerees, we stand today to ensure our country does not repeat the mistakes of the past.

Objectives: Provide a substantial monetary contribution to support and defend the human and civil rights of all people and protect the Constitution of the United States of America.

Restrictions: Applications will be accepted from 501(c)(3) organizations. Funding may support the underwriting of and participation in community-wide projects which will further the JACL's objectives. Grants up to \$30,000 may be awarded. Political campaign activities are not eligible for a grant and will not be considered.

Important Dates and Deadlines: Application opens May 29th, applications due June 27th. Applications received by the designated deadline will be eligible for funds that will be distributed no later than 60 days thereafter.

Application Review Process: All applications will be reviewed first by the Grant Committee. Applications that meet committee approval will be reviewed by the Board of Directors and the Board of Trustees of the Berkeley JACL for final approval.
